February often feels like a quiet month. The decorations of Christmas are long put away, the new year has settled into routine, and the days are still short. Yet in the church, February carries us to the edge of one of our most meaningful seasons — Lent.

Lent is not a season we rush into lightly. It begins with ashes and honesty. On February 18, Ash Wednesday, we hear the ancient words, “Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.” These words are not meant to discourage us, but to ground us. They remind us that we are fragile, dependent, and deeply in need of God’s mercy and grace.

Lent is a gift. It is a time to pause, to reflect, and to return to God. We take time to pray and to return to what truly gives life. In a world that constantly urges us to be faster, stronger, and more self-sufficient, Lent invites us to be truthful, humble, and open before the Lord.

The Scriptures for this season will lead us through stories of wilderness, testing, repentance, and trust. They remind us that God does not abandon us in these places, but meets us there. Just as God provided water from the rock and manna in the desert, God provides mercy, forgiveness, and new life for us today.

As we begin this holy journey, I invite you to consider a simple Lenten practice:


- setting aside time each day for prayer,

- and fasting from whatever distracts us from God’s presence.

These practices are not about earning God’s love, as we already have that. They are about making space to receive the love of the Lord more fully.

May this Lenten season be a time of deepened faith, renewed hope, and quiet transformation. And may we walk together toward the cross, trusting that resurrection always has the final word.

LENTEN OFFERINGS The LARC Lenten offerings received on Wednesday evenings will be donated to Hearken House Ministry. Hearken House Ministry provides a work/training program for those being released on parole from a Pennsylvania state or county jail and who strongly desire to change the way of life they have chosen in the past.

Participants must be willing to receive personal management and relationship training relating to keeping promises, being accountable, displaying love, and demonstrating dependability. Participants must commit to its work/training program requiring residents to work full-time at the ministry's warehouse. Participants will learn to operate pallet jacks, forklifts, and other tools and machinery. While contributing as a part of a team, participants receive compensation and learn valuable work skills to be used upon graduating. Checks to support Hearken House may be made payable to LARC.

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

Property

- Chambersburg Anglican Fellowship will be renting our chapel space and one additional room on Sunday mornings from 8 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. at a cost of \$25 per week. They will use the space every other week.
- Cumberland Valley School of Music has an interest in renting 2-3 rooms for lessons this coming fall. We meet with them on January 15 to discuss.

Long Range Planning

- The Executive Committee is meeting with Trinity Lutheran Leadership on January 20 to discuss our building and explore possibilities.
- Contracting with Real Estate Attorney, Mark Orndorf, to help us legally explore the potential disposition of the church facility and how to work with the Rose Rent Agreement. His report states that properties devoted to a charitable use receive special protection under PA law and that oversight rests with the PA Attorney General to ensure that charitable assets are preserved and used for their intended purpose. The Orphans Court of PA would work with the sale and it is believed that the Rose Rent agreement would be incorporated into this proceeding. The court could exercise its authority to ‘extinguish’ or modify the covenant if it determines that continued compliance is no longer feasible in light of the congregation’s declining membership and disposition of the property.
- The council will review the proposal presented by Architect, Vern McKissick, to provide consulting services for a ‘Condition Assessment and Rehabilitation Plan’ for our current facility. The council will consider this at the February meeting.

A SCHOOL FOR DEAF CHILDREN

In the remote Amazon of Peru, over 3,000 deaf children face a heartbreakingly reality. Without access to education in their own language – Peruvian Sign Language, most are hidden away to work in fields or beg on streets. Many experience violence and exploitation. For indigenous deaf children in rural communities, the risk of trafficking is devastatingly high. But there is hope.

Peace and Hope's School for deaf children in Nueva Cajamarca is proving that with the right support, deaf children can thrive. This pioneering school provides free education in Peruvian Sign language, while teaching families sign language and building a supportive deaf community. Peru has over 532,000 people with hearing disabilities, yet the entire country has only one state school for deaf children. The School for the Deaf (La Escuelita Para Sordos) is a pilot program designed to demonstrate what's possible when deaf children receive quality education. The goal is to show Peru's Ministry of Education a model that works and would pave the way for state funded schools throughout the country.

We have a direct link to this school through Jon Raber, our missionary at Peace and Hope international. We have supported this school through the Stouffer fund and have joined other churches to help this school grow. We are blessed to be a blessing!
